

If you pay income tax, or have a capital gains tax liability, it is possible for your church to reclaim the tax back on the money you give.

All that needs to happen is for the declaration contained within this leaflet to be signed.

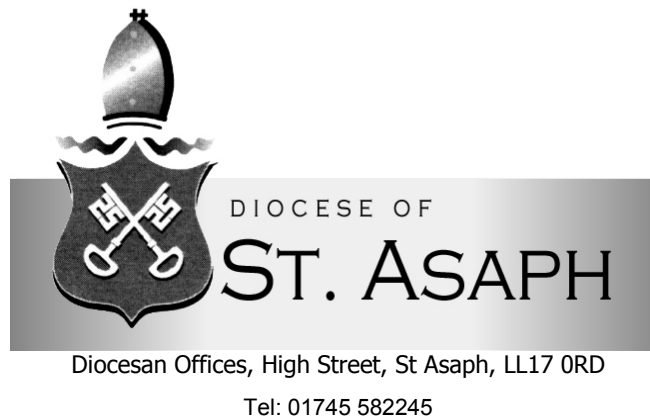
Your full name does need to be stated – at the last count there were 12,218 people named “John Smith” in the United Kingdom.

Your Post Code is also necessary.

The declaration will be kept within the local church and all identifiable donations made can be grown by means of a tax refund, to the parish, at no cost to you.

I understand that, to qualify for Gift Aid, what I pay in income tax or capital gains tax must at least equal the amount the Church will reclaim on my donations. (Which is currently 28p for every £ given by Gift Aid.)
